Adele of Meaux (c. 934 – c. 982), (a.k.a. "Adele of Vermandois") was a French noblewoman. She was Countess of Chalon and later Countess of Anjou.

Adele was a daughter of Robert of Vermandois, Count of Meaux and Troyes, and Adelaide de Chalon.^[1] Adele died in 982.^[2]

Family

She married c. 970 Lambert, Count of Chalon († 22 February 978). Their children were:

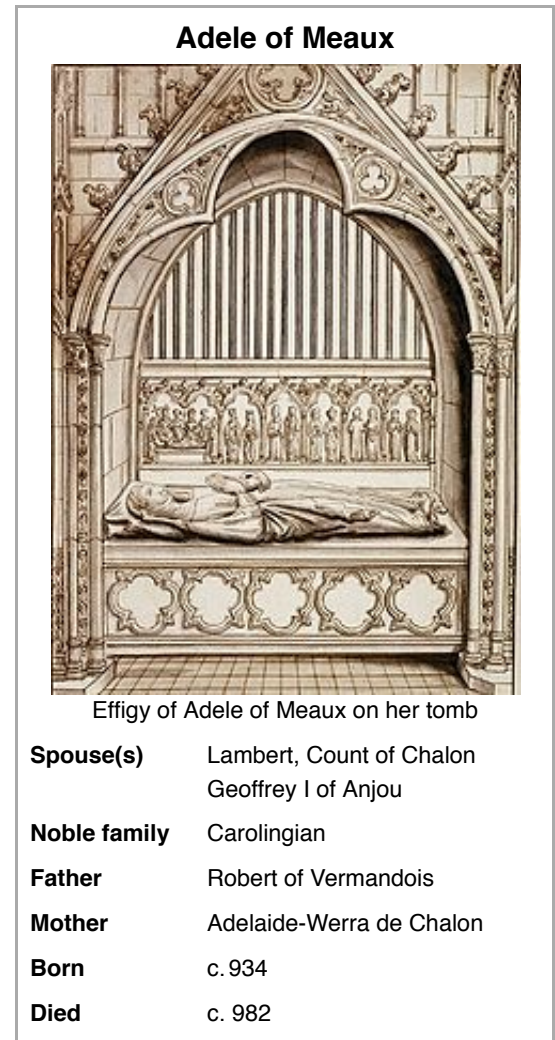
- Hugh I of Autun, Bishop of Auxerre and Count of Chalon. († 1039).^[3]
- Mahaut of Autun, Dame de Donzy († bef. 1019).^[3]
- Aelis of Chalon, who married c. 991 Guy I, Count of Macon.^[3]
