

# **Robert Hungerford, 2nd Baron Hungerford**

**Robert Hungerford, 2nd Baron Hungerford** (1409–1459), the second but eldest surviving son of Walter Hungerford, 1st Baron Hungerford, served in the Hundred Years' War, and was summoned to parliament as Baron Hungerford from 5 September 1450 to 26 May 1455. He died 14 May 1459, and in accordance with his will was buried in Salisbury Cathedral.<sup>[1]</sup> He was succeeded by his son Robert Hungerford, 3rd Baron Hungerford (1431–1464).<sup>[2]</sup>

His mother (Catherine Peverell) and his wife Margaret, the wealthy heiress of William de Botreaux, 3rd Baron Botreaux, added to the landed property of his family in Cornwall.<sup>[3]</sup> His wife lived until 7 February 1478, surviving all her descendants, excepting a great-granddaughter, Mary Hastings, 4th Baroness Hungerford. Her will, dated 8 August 1476, is printed in Nicholas Harris Nicolas's *Testamenta Vetusta*,<sup>[4]</sup> and in Hoare's "*Modern Wiltshire, Hundred of Heytesbury*. A list of the heavy expenses she incurred in ransoming her son Robert appears in William Dugdale's *Baronage*<sup>[2][5]</sup>
